**Examples of Service**

The UCLA Graduate School of Education and Information Studies (GSEIS) is committed to public service through improving access to quality education and educational outcomes. GSEIS runs the Black Male Institute, the Center for Improving Child Care Quality (CICCCQ), the Center for International & Development Education (CIDE), Center X, Civil Rights Project/Proyecto Derechos Civiles (CRP), Institute for Democracy, Education, and Access (IDEA), Institute for Immigration, Globalization, and Education (IGE), The Paulo Freire Institute (PFI), and the Sudikoff Family Institute. In addition, GSEIS's is integrally involved in its partner schools, the UCLA Lab School and UCLA Community School. Finally, GSEIS also runs the Choices Project, a research initiative which aims to improve the academic options, experiences, and outcomes of African American and Latino students in the California system of higher education.

\* Tier 1 refers to courses directly addressing diversity. Specific topics include age, gender, disability, sexuality, religion, race, ethnicity, nationality, and socioeconomic inequality as they affect current issues in US populations as they affect current issues in US populations.

Tier 2 refers to courses addressing topics that contain diverse perspectives and populations at various points in history, including courses such as area studies and languages. This category also looks at age, gender, disability, sexuality, religion, race, ethnicity, nationality, and socioeconomic inequality, but does so more broadly than Tier 1.
