The Fielding School's research centers include the WORLD Policy Analysis Center as well as the Center for Global and Immigrant Health, The Bixby Center on Population and Reproductive Health, The Center for Healthier Children, Families, and Communities, The Center on Occupational and Environmental Health, The Center for Public Health

and Disasters, The Global Media Center for Social Impact, The UCLA Center for Health Advancement, The UCLA Center for Health Policy Research, The UCLA Kaiser Permanente Center for Health Equity, and The UCLA/RAND Prevention Research Center.

* Tier 1 refers to courses directly addressing diversity. Specific topics include age, gender, disability, sexuality, religion, race, ethnicity, nationality, and socioeconomic inequality as they affect current issues in US populations as they affect current issues in US populations.

Tier 2 refers to courses addressing topics that contain diverse perspectives and populations at various points in history, including courses such as area studies and languages. This category also looks at age, gender, disability, sexuality, religion, race, ethnicity, nationality, and socioeconomic inequality, but does so more broadly than Tier 1.
