Examples of Service

The UCLA Division of Social Sciences is very committed to service programs related to diversity including numerous research initiatives that have provided guidance to local,

national and global leaders, policymakers, and citizens on a wide-variety of topics such as: labor, socioeconomic inequality, gender, sexuality, racial and ethnic studies, education, public policy, and indigenous studies. Research centers include: the Center for the Study of Women, the Center for American Politics and Public Policy, the California Center for Population Research, the California Census Research Data Center, the Center on the Everyday Lives of Families, the Cesar Chavez Digital Mural Lab Center, the Center for Social Theory and Comparative History, the Center for the Study of Urban Poverty, the Institute for Research on Labor and Employment, the Marcus Garvey and UNIA Papers Project, and the National Center for History in the Schools.

* Tier 1 refers to courses directly addressing diversity. Specific topics include age, gender, disability, sexuality, religion, race, ethnicity, nationality, and socioeconomic inequality as they affect current issues in US populations as they affect current issues in US populations.

Tier 2 refers to courses addressing topics that contain diverse perspectives and populations at various points in history, including courses such as area studies and languages. This category also looks at age, gender, disability, sexuality, religion, race, ethnicity, nationality, and socioeconomic inequality, but does so more broadly than Tier 1.
